## **New Policing Structure**

A new policing structure will start on 12 September. Kent Police have recruited more officers across the County to tackle their priorities which are:-

Child Sexual Exploitation

Counter Terrorism & Domestic Extremism

Human Trafficking & Modern Slavery

High Harm Impact Crime (vulnerable people, burglary, drugs)

Domestic Abuse, Serious Crime and Sexual Offences

There are 3 dedicated PCSOs based in the CSU that are working on Domestic Abuse, Vulnerable Adults and Schools/Young People. These dedicated roles will help address local concerns/issues and work with other partners in the CSU to reduce vulnerable victims.

PCSO areas have also changed and each PCSO will work in teams of 2 across the District.

This new structure will help officers to be more proactive as well as reactive in dealing with reports of crime. For more information on Kent Police go to their website www.kentpolice.uk


#### Giveaways
