All of us here within the CSU wish you a safe and happy Christmas and hope you have lots of fun and joy over the festive period.

If there is an incident that occurs over this time, the new on line reporting system is now available.

https://www.kent.police.uk/services/report-a-crime/kent-police-online-reporting/

This service was introduced to help residents have an alternative to calling 101. To help Police in their investigations when you make the report, please ensure you have (if available):

- The date and time of the crime/incident
- Details of any stolen or damaged items (i.e. IMEI number for your mobile, vehicle registration)
- The contact details of any witnesses
- Information about any evidence that could help an investigation



Currently it is not possible to upload attachments; this function will be introduced later. There are separate sections within the form for you to add the different information required at this stage. Once submitted, you'll receive a reference number and a copy of your report (if selected). **Please note this service is not to be used for emergencies; that is still 999.**


